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Result of Palestinian Public Opinion Polls No. 12 May 11-13, 2005

Background:

One hundred days have elapsed since Mahmoud Abbas was elected President of the Palestinian Authority. A period during which he was able to reach an agreement with the Palestinian factions to declare a truce with the Israelis, and to introduce some changes in the structure of the Palestinian security apparatuses; he issued an order to unify all security apparatuses reducing their number to three main bodies. Further, Abbas reopened several internal files in an attempt to apply the rule of law and to activate the judicious system.

On the other side of the Palestinian scene, the second stage of local councils elections which was conducted in 84 sites in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip was completed on May 5th, 2005. The elections resulted in the winning of the candidates of Hamas and Fateh in most locations; Hamas scored advancement in the Gaza Strip. As a result of these elections some officials in Fateh resigned due to their failure to achieve a victory for their movement in their elections sites.

Within this context of elections talks, the Legislative Council elections law is still not approved because of some disagreement among the members of the Legislative Council on the form of this law. While the Cairo dialogue among the representatives of Palestinian political factions resulted in passing a law on the basis of half for percentage representation and half for the circles; the majority of Legislative Council members insist on the principle of one third for percentage representation and two thirds for circles. There is a talk about a suggestion advocating a law based on percentage representation. It is worth mentioning here that the declared date of the Legislative Council elections is mid July.

The Results:

Following are the results of the Twelfth Palestinian Public Opinion Poll conducted by the Center for Opinion Polls and Survey Studies at An-Najah National University during the period from May 11 to 13, 2005. The University sponsors all polls conducted by its center.

The Twelfth Poll undertakes several subjects which are basically concerned with the coming Legislative Council election, an assessment of the performance of the institution of the Palestinian Authority, the state of democracy and human rights in the West Bank and Gaza Strip, in addition to political sympathies and other issues.

The sample included 1360 persons whose age group is 18 years and above and who have the right to vote. The sample forms one per thousand from among the total number of Palestinian people of this age group. The enclosed questionnaire was distributed on 860 persons from the West Bank and 500 persons from the Gaza Strip. The sample was drawn randomly and the margin of error is about $\pm 3\%$. Still 1.3% of the members of the sample refused to answer the questionnaire.

Major Results:

- 40.3% from among respondents believe that the Legislative Council elections will be conducted in July of this year.
- 67.2% believe that Mahmoud Abbas is really concerned with conducting the LC elections on its announced date of mid July.
- 35.4 % from among respondents believe that the present LC members are really concerned with conducting the elections on its announced date in July.
- 63.6% do not know what the mixed election law means.
- 56.8% do not know what percentage representation means, and 44.9% do not know what dividing the country into circles for the LC elections means.
- In the coming LC elections 35.1% prefer dividing the country into circles according to governates; and 33.1% prefer to have the whole country as a single circle. While 12.4% prefer a mixed elections system based on half for circles and half for percentage representations, 5.4% prefer an elections system based on two-thirds for circles and one third for percentage representation.
- 80.3% from among respondents trust the members of the Central Elections Committee.
- 71.8% from among respondents will participate in the coming legislative elections and 14.5% have not decided yet.



- 4.0% from among respondents will reelect the same members of the present LC, and 22.1% will not vote for any of them.
- The characteristics that respondents see in the person they want to vote for in the coming LC elections are arranged as follows:

- The basic principle that will define the attitudes of voters in giving their vote to a candidate will be personal acquaintance with a percentage of 26.9%, followed by belogness to a party with a percentage of 26.5%.
- 25.9% from among respondents will vote for Fateh block in the coming LC elections, 20.9% will vote for Hamas, and 5.1% will vote for a block from among members of the Palestinian left.
- If the choice before the Palestinian voters in the LC elections were limited to a choice of two blocks, one representing the PLO and one representing Hamas, respondents who vote for the PLO were 44.9% and those who vote for Hamas were 37.7%.
- 29.2% from among respondents will not elect all or some members from the present LC members because of the abuse of public funds by members, 24.5% because of the appointment of their relatives in public positions, 30.2% because of being remote from the problems and worries of the people of the elections circle that they represent and 7.8% because these representatives have never visited the people in their circle since their election.
- The percentages of respondents who are satisfied of:
 - The Palestinian Presidential Institution 72.2%.
 - The Palestinian Government 67.5%.
 - The Palestinian Legislative Council 52.2%.
 - The Palestinian judicious system 60.5%.
 - The Palestinian security apparatuses 55.8%.



• From among respondents believe that President Mahmoud Abbas began practical and tangible steps in the following domains:

- 26.8% from among respondents believe that the changes that President Abbas introduced are meant to be genuinely for reform, 18.3% believes that they are formal and useless procedures.
- 22.6% believe that the state of democracy in Palestine is good; 31.4% say it is bad.
- 26.5% say that the political system in Palestine is proceeding towards building a democratic system.
- 30.4% say that the political system in Palestine is proceeding towards respecting human rights.
- 22.1% from among respondents assess respects of human rights by the Palestinian Authority as "good".
- 32.2% from among respondents assess respect of freedom of press by the Palestinian Authority as "good".
- 47.1% from among respondent say that they are able to criticize the policies of the Palestinian Authority without fear.
- 45.6% from among respondents say that they express their political opinions without fear.
- 39.4% from among respondents believe that the Palestinian social system gives them the freedom to adopt any religion or thought they choose while 37.6% say the contrary.
- 76.5% from among respondents believe that the government's expenditures on the education sector is not enough to meet the educational needs, and 73.3% believe that the expenditures on the health sector is also not enough and so is the expenditures on social welfare with a 71.2%.
- 87.4% from among respondents do not feel safe neither for themselves nor for their families and properties.
- 87.4% from among respondents support the teachers' demands to improve their financial situation and 54.3% support strike as a form of struggle to achieve their demands.



- 41.0% from among respondents believe that the second stage of local councils elections was conducted in a democratic atmosphere.
- 42.7% from among respondents believe that voters relied on their choice of their candidates to the local council on the political affiliation to a party, 17.1% relied on the family dimension and 20.4% relied on the competence of the candidate.
- 22.4% from among respondents believe that the local council elections are a victory to tribalism and 66.6% believe that they are a victory to the parties.
