Description

Teaching portfolios were first devised in Canada over 30 years ago as a way of documenting teaching accomplishments and a means of reflecting on teaching with the aim of making improvements. Since then portfolios have been used world-wide, and are now often required for new applicants for university teaching positions. This workshop-seminar will explore the rationale for using portfolios as a way of evaluating teaching, and participants will be able to explore their own teaching philosophy and teaching accomplishments, and to begin work on preparing their own portfolio.
