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# Results of Palestinian Public Opinion Polls No. 4 January 15-17, 2004

#### Background

The period prior to this poll witnessed many developments on the Palestinian political arena. Among these were the Cairo dialogue among Palestinian factions which did not lead to an agreed-upon work program shared by all, the declaration made by the Palestinian Prime Minister concerning a possible intention of Palestinians to call for a bi-national state (for both Israelis and Palestinians) if Israel continues to pursue its current political policy, and the declaration made by Ahmed Yasin that Hamas agrees on the creation of a Palestinian State within 1967 borders without a recognition of an Israeli state.

The political activities on the Palestinian arena witnessed a visible stagnation as relates to either the Quartet Committee's role, the role of the European Union or the role of other international mediators in pushing forward the implementation of the Road Map. Further, negotiations among Palestinian factions concerning the cessation of military operations inside Israel still go through a vacuum for several internal and external reasons.

# The Results:

Following are the results of the fourth public opinion poll conducted by the Center for Opinion Polls and Survey Studies at An-Najah National University from 15-17 January 2004. **The University took full sponsorship of the whole poll.** 

This poll undertakes several issues such as the declaration of Mr. Ahmed Qurai concerning a bi-national state, Sheik Ahmed Yassin's opinion on a Palestinian State within the 1967 borders, the Road Map destiny, the possibility of declaring a new ceasefire, the evaluation of the performance of Palestinian institutions and Mr. Qurai's government, the PLC and local council elections, and the political affiliation.

The Sample included 1630 persons whose age group is 18 year and above and who have the right to vote. The Sample forms one per thousand from among the total number of Palestinian people of this age group. The enclosed questionnaire was distributed on 860 persons from the West Bank and 500 persons from Gaza Strip.

The sample was chosen randomly and the margin of error of the sample is about  $\pm 3$  per cent; 2.5% of the members of the sample, however, refused to answer the questionnaire.

# The Major Results:

- As for Mr. Qurai's declaration in which he expressed the possibility that Palestinians may call for a bi-national state shared by both Palestinians and Israelis with the same rights and privileges enjoyed by Israelis if Israel continues to execute its policy which aims at confiscating large areas of the West Bank, 21.1% say that they support Qurai's declaration because it scares the Israelis and serves the purpose of creating a Palestinian state within the 1967 boarders; 19.4%, however, say that they reject the declaration because it confuses Palestinian endeavors to establish a Palestinian State within the 1967 boarders. 33.6% see that the declaration was only a political tactic which has no realistic value. 15.6% see that the declaration reflects the failure of the Palestinian Government to propose a realistic political project to lead them out of the current crisis. While 5.4% see the declaration an implicit threat to dissolve the Palestinian Authority.
- As for Sheik Ahmed Yassin's declaration concerning accepting a Palestinian State within the 1967 boarders without recognizing an Israeli state, 46.2% see that the declaration is realistic and in harmony with the highest Palestinian interest. While 24.0% believe that the declaration is not realistic and that it does not serve the purpose of creating a





Palestinian State within the 1967 boarders, 22.4% see that the Israelis may use it to promote the notion that Palestinians do not want to recognize an Israeli state even if Israel approves a Palestinian one.

- 14.7% from among the respondents see that the reason Palestinian factions have not reached an agreement on a political program through the different dialogues (the Cairo dialogue was the latest) is related to advancing the private interest of individual parties on the national one. While 12.2% of the respondents believe that the participants in these dialogues are not serious in their endeavors to reach an agreement, 26.3% believe that failure to reach an agreement is related to the a adherence of each party to its own political program. 20.3% believe that participants in such dialogues are incapable of setting a unified political program to serve the Palestinian people, and 19.8% attribute lack of agreement to outside pressures.
- 55.9% from among the respondent call for a clear separation between the responsibilities of the Head of the Palestinian Authority and those of the Prime Minister.
- 36.0% of the respondents believe that Ahmed Quari is incapable of performing fully as a prime minister.
- 46.4% believe that Ahmed Qurai will work in favor of implementing the items of the Road Map.
- 33.4% believe that the Prime Minister and his government will not succeed in the implementation of their obligations as stated in the Road Map.
- 48.9% support the commitment of the Palestinian Authority to the Road Map after the declaration made by the American Administration that the American Administration is still committed to the Road Map.
- 43.5% believe that the Palestinian Authority is incapable of meeting its obligations as stated in the Road Map.
- 77.2% believe that the Road Map will not lead to the creation of an independent Palestinian state with sovereign boarders in the West Bank and Gaza Strip.
- 82.2% believe that the US Administration is not serious in its endeavors to implement the Road Map.
- While 46.8% believe that the US Administration will impose its conditions in the implementation of the Road Map on Palestinians only, 41.5% believe that the US Administration will impose its conditions more on Palestinians.
- 50.7% believe that the Road Map is doomed to fail and 39.9% believe that it is a temporary solution.
- 70.6% assert that there is a need for international forces in the West Bank and Gaza Strip to supervise the implementation of the Road Map or any others future Palestinian – Israeli agreement.
- 66.3% believe that the Road Map as an agreement is not any longer viable.





- 71.0% Support a new ceasefire (hodna) between Palestinians and Israelis on the basis of not targeting Palestinian and Israeli civilians.
- 67.3% Support a new ceasefire (hodna) if Israel commits itself to one.
- 60.2% assert that the Palestinian National and Islamic factions should agree on a new ceasefire.
- 49.9% see the necessity of holding a ceasefire between the Palestinian Authority and Israel under an international supervision.
- 56.7% from among the respondents support procedures made by the Palestinian Authority leading to limiting Palestinian operations inside Israel if a new truce is declared.
- 91.7% support the idea that Palestinian armed operations come as a natural reaction to the Israeli provocations.
- 34.2% from among respondents believe that Ahmed Qurai's government is capable of fighting corruption, 29.9% believe that it is capable of achieving a ceasefire, 42.4% believe that it is capable of imposing order over the interior affairs, and 37.9% believe that it is capable of improving the economic situation.
- As for the evaluation of the performance of Palestinian institutions in the present time.
  - 72.4% expressed satisfaction with the performance of the Palestinian Presidency.
  - 60.3% expressed satisfaction with the Legislative Council.
  - 61.6% expressed satisfaction with the performance of the Palestinian judicious system.
  - 89.9% expressed satisfaction with the performance of the Palestinian universities.
  - 84.6% expressed satisfaction with the performance of Palestinian local societies and organizations.
  - 57.7% expressed satisfaction with the performance of the security apparatuses.
- 94.0% from among respondents assert that there is a need for the formation of a united Palestinian leadership.
- 77.8% believe that there is a need for restoring respect to the Palestinian Liberation Organization in view of the present realities of the Palestinian Authority.
- As for the priorities of the respondents in the present, they come according to the following condescending order.
  - An average of 94.3% favor freeing prisoners from Israeli Jails.
  - An average of 92.1% favor the uplifting of road blocks and check points placed between Palestinian cities and villages.
  - An average of 91.1% favor creating job opportunities.
  - An average of 90.0% favor the improvement of the economic situation.
  - An average of 88.3% favor the improvement of public education.





- An average of 88.1% favor the improvement of the public health services.
  - An average of 87.1% favor reinforcing Palestinian local security.
- 63.9% support the on-going peace process between the Palestinians and the Israelis.
- Only 4.1% of the respondents assert that they will reelect the same members of the PLC that they elected before, and 9.0% assert that they will reelect only some of the old members. While 19.0% assert that they will not reelect any of the previous members, 43.0% assert that they will decide on whom to vote for at the Polls. Further, 22.3% assert that they will not participate in the elections.
- As for the characteristics they desire to see in future candidates running for the PLC, they favor the following in a condescending order.
  - 1- An average of 88.2% favor the educational qualifications.
  - 2- An average of 78.8%, favor the patriotic record of the candidate.
  - 3- An average of 52.9% favor male gender.
  - 4- An average of 51.4% favor the political affiliation of the candidate.
  - 5- An average of 40.4% care for the economic situation of the candidate.
  - 6- An average of 36.8% care for the family belongness of the candidate.
  - 7- An average of 33.4% care for place of dwelling.
  - 8- An Average of 33.1% favor the female gender.
  - 9- An average of 32.1% favor previous PLC members.
  - 10-An average of 31.9% care for kinship.
- 62.8% assert that there is a need for conducting elections for local councils in the coming period.
- 45.6% believe that the PA is serious in its call for elections in June, 2004.
- 51.8% see that the outlaw situation can be rectified through the enforcement of law on all without exception. While 3.2% see that aggressors must be nationally and socially isolated, 10.1% see that they must be tried before the courts of law. 11.8% say that arms which are only used to provoke troubles must be collected. 19.1%, however, believe that this chaotic situation can be eradicated by ending all forms of nepotism, mediation and protection of aggressors by people with influence in the society.
- 66.5% said that they have health insurance.
- 74.4% from among those who said that they have medical insurance say that they have a public health insurance (government insurance), 5.6% say that they have private insurance and 12.4% say that they are insured through the UNRWA.





- As for those who have public insurance 13.9% say that it is very good; 21.6% say that the private insurance is very good. and 11.6% say that the UNRAW insurance is very good.
- 75.1% from among the respondents assert that the current Intifada influenced their economic situation negatively.
- As for those who say that the Intifada influenced their economic situation negatively, they assert that they were able to cope up with their economic situations according to the following priorities.
  - An average of 89.5% say that they concentrate on necessities only without caring for other commodities.
  - An average of 38.0% say that they rely on aids.
  - An average of 32.5% say that they resort to work in agriculture and home economy.
  - An average of 32.4% say that they depend on increasing work hours.
  - An average of 1.0% say that they depend on child labor.
- Generally speaking the performance of Arab TV space channels is seen excellent by respondents in covering the political developments of the latest period on the Palestinian arena. The surveyed channels and the results of their evaluations were as follows: Aljazeera 45.4%, Abu Dhabi 34.2%, Al Arabyia 33.8%, and Palestine Space Channel 22.3%.
- As for Political affiliations they were distributed as follows:
