A Lecture on Legal Frameworks of the Apartheid Wall Held at an-Najah:

25/6/2009

In Continuation for the RJI's lectures of the Leadership Training Institute 2009, a lecture was held at Zafer Al-Masri Auditoriums at An-Najah National University's Old Campus. The lecture titled "Legal Frameworks of the Apartheid Wall" was given by Dr. Fadi Shadid, the Lecturer at Faculty of Law.

Dr. Shadid went through three main proceedings regard this issue: Legal protection of properties lost after building the wall; Israeli's violations through the apartheid wall and settlements; legal accommodation of violation and methods of solving the issue. Dr. Shadid said that all the Palestinian territories are under occupation, and are therefore subject to the War Military Law and all international conventions. Hence, building this wall is totally illegal and against all international agreements. He talked about the legal protection of both private and public properties according to the international agreements of Danhag and Geneva Conventions; Israelis are in violation of these conventions. The speaker referred to the specific articles that indicate the illegality of these acts by the Israelis.

Through an interesting environment of discussion, the effects of the Wall were discussed in terms on their violation to the international charters, and the human rights of the Palestinians. The lecture was attended by the University's students, international volunteers and academics of the faculties of the university. Participant and attendants presented their recommendations regard this issue.
