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### Result of Palestinian Public Opinion Polls No. 11 March 16-18, 2005

#### **Background:**

There has been a revival of local, national and international diplomatic activities since the inauguration of Mahmoud Abbas as the President of the Palestinian Authority to reactivate the Palestinian – Israeli negotiations. A summit was held at Sharm el-Sheikh in which Jordan and Egypt participated in addition to the Palestinian Authority, Israel and the USA. Following this summit there was the London conference which basically aimed at offering political and financial support to the new Palestinian leadership.

Diplomatic activities aside, Israel still delays withdrawal from Palestinian cities which had been agreed upon at the Sharm el-Sheikh Summit, confiscates more of the Palestinian lands, continues to build the separation wall and continues the killing of Palestinian people and the incursions in Palestinian cities and villages.

On the other side of the Palestinian scene, the Palestinian government was formed after a long debate; it is the first government to be formed under the presidency of Mahmoud Abbas and the first government the majority of whose members are not members in the Legislative Council.

The Palestinian political arena still witnesses the consequences of the first stage of the local councils elections which were held in the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. Hamas and the clan coalitions reaped a good number of the seats in these councils. Hamas had announced earlier that it will participate in the coming legislative elections.

### The Results:

Following are the results of the Eleventh Palestinian Public Opinion Poll conducted by the Center for Opinion Polls and Survey Studies at An-Najah National University during the period from March 16 to 19, 2005. The University sponsors all polls conducted by its center.

The Eleventh Poll undertakes several subjects focusing on the Presidential elections, the priorities of individuals in the period following the elections, the elections programs of candidates, the people's opinion in the peace process and the Road Map in addition to political sympathies and other issues.

The sample included 1361 persons whose age group is 18 years and above and who have the right to vote. The sample forms one per thousand from among the total number of Palestinian people of this age group. The enclosed questionnaire was distributed on 860 persons from the West Bank and 501 persons from the Gaza Strip. The sample was drawn randomly and the margin of error is about  $\pm 3\%$ . Still 2.2% of the members of the sample refused to answer the questionnaire.

### Major Results:

- 39.6% from among respondents believe that Mahmoud Abbas will fulfill his promises concerning reform and fighting corruption, and 40.4% believe that he will provide security for Palestinians.
- 44.4% believe that Mahmoud Abbas is capable of conducting comprehensive reform in the institutions of the Palestinian Authority.
- 37.5% believe that under the current situation, Mahmoud Abbas is capable of controlling the local security conditions.
- After two months in office as President of the Palestinian Authority 25.1% from among respondents feel that there is an improvement in personal security, 11.7% feel that there is an improvement in the economic situation, and 21.8% feel that there is some freedom in movement between cities.
- 81.1% from among respondents support the giving up of operations against Israeli targets by Palestinian factions since the Palestinian Authority announced reaching an agreement with these factions on a truce.
- 49% say that they are satisfied with the formation of the Palestinian government as it stands now.



- 25.5% from among respondents heard or read about the programs of the new Palestinian government.
- 31.8% from among respondents say that the new Palestinian government is capable of making a real reform in the institutions and apparatuses of the Palestinian Authority.
- In the coming period, the percentage of those who said that President Mahmoud Abbas is capable of:

- Generally speaking 27.4% from among respondents hope that President Mahmoud Abbas will fight corruption in the near future, 21.2% hope that he will enforce law and order, 23.6% hope that he will uplift the Israeli checkpoints, 6.6% hope that he will improve education and health services and 19.3% hope that he will put an end to poverty and unemployment.
- 76.4% from among respondents support the appointment of a vice president by President Mahmoud Abbas.
- 52.9% from among respondents support involving Egypt and Jordan in the rehabilitation of Palestinian security apparatuses if Israel pulls out from the Gaza Strip and areas in the northern part of the West Bank.
- 49.8% from among respondents support inviting the Jordan-based Bader Troops to the areas that Israel will evacuate in the northern part of the West Bank.

- 70.2% from among respondents say that they will participate in the coming legislative elections.
- In the coming Legislative Council elections, 19.8% say that they will not reelect any one from among the members they elected in the past, 2.3% say that they will reelect the same members they elected in the past, 7.5% say they will reelect some members they elected in the past, 56.3% say they will decide on whom to elect at the polls.
- The characteristics that respondents think are required in the candidate they will elect in the coming legislative elections are given in the following order:

- As for Legislative Council elections according to the traditional tickets, 27.2% from among respondents say they will vote for Fateh block, 13.7% will vote for Hamas block, 3.3% will vote for the Palestinian left, 1.5% will vote for the Palestinian National Initiative, 5.4% will vote for a block which contains independent national members, 5.7% say they will vote for a block which contains independent Islamic members and 33.2% say they will decide at the time of the elections.
- 75.3% from among respondents believe that there will be an organized opposition in the Palestinian political life regardless of the side which will form the government after the coming Legislative elections.
- 78.7% from among respondents believe that Hamas' decision to participate in the coming Legislative elections will cause a qualitative move in the Palestinian political action.
- 44.5% believe that Hamas' agreement to participate in the coming legislative elections is an implicit recognition of the Oslo accords.
- 71.0% support the participation of Hamas in the legislative elections despite the fact that the reference of these elections is the Oslo accords.



- In areas where local council's elections did not take place 70.5% say they will participate in these elections and 10.5% say they haven't decided yet.
- In the coming local councils elections, 17.6% say they will vote on the basis of belongness to a political party, 6.1% say they will vote on the basis of family belongness, 19.7% say they will vote on the basis of personal acquaintance with the candidate, 13.9% say they will vote on family and party basis, and 40.2% say they haven't decided yet.
- 75.5% from among respondents still support the ongoing peace process between the Palestinians and the Israelis.
- 28.5% from among respondents believe that the Road Map as an agreement is still viable.
- 73.6% expect that a decision on a ceasefire agreement with the Israelis will be taken after the meeting of the Palestinian factions in Cairo.
- 89.1% from among respondents support taking a decision in favor of a truce.
- 85.1% believe that Israeli's continuous delay of executing its Sharm el-Sheikh commitment to withdraw from the West Bank cities will lead to an eruption of armed operations.
- 75.8% believe that restoring dignity to the PLO under the current situation that Palestinian people go through is necessary.
- 15.6% from among respondents feel secure for themselves, for their families and properties.
- 46.2% from among respondents are optimistic about the general future of the Palestinian people in the coming few years.
- 6.2% from among respondents believe that the US Administration will force Israel to withdraw to the 1967 borders so that a Palestinian state will be established within these borders. While 24.2% believe the US Administration will force Israel to withdraw from some areas, 63.6% believe that the US Administration will not force Israel to any withdrawal and Israel will decide the size of its withdrawal.
- For the EU support to the Palestinian Authority:
  - 26.9% believe that the EU support in the political domain is good
  - 41.8% believe that the EU support in financial domain is good
  - 39.5% believe that the EU support in the domain of infrastructure is good.



- For the Arab Countries' support to the Palestinian Authority:
  - 15.2% believe that the Arab Countries' support in the political domain is good
  - 19.3% believe that the Arab Countries' support in financial domain is good
  - 15.8% believe that the Arab Countries' support in the domain of infrastructure is good.
- From among respondents say that the time needed for a trip between their place of habitation and the nearest city during the Intifada due to Israeli checkpoints has increased:
  - Four times 17.3%
  - Three times 25.3%
    - two times 37.3%
- From among respondents say that the travel fare from their place of habitation to the nearest city during the Intifada and because of Israeli checkpoints has increased:
  - Four times 9.5%
  - Three times 24.6%
  - Two times 47.0%
